## The Challenge





#### **Issues Identified:**

- Inconsistent data quality & accuracy (implementation varies per Member State).
- Delayed PNR system rollouts; regulatory constraints.
- No common European PNR platform or consensus.
- Disparate national approaches undercut system effectiveness.
- Growing IT system queries strain resources & erode trust.
- API/PNR integration issues hinder identity verification & security.

### Motivation









- Substantial investment made by EU and Schengen States to face the increasing pressure at the EU borders
- Non-homogenised methodologies between Individual countries and respective Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs)
- Low travel intelligence systems interoperability across Europe due to regulatory and cultural issues
- Quality of related data and accuracy of information
- Delays on the implementation of PNR-related IT solutions to cover both national and EU needs
